News

► ESSL receives 'Landmark'
Award The European Severe
Storms Laboratory (ESSL) has been
selected for an award by the German government. The European
Severe Weather Database ESWD
was chosen as one of the "365
Landmarks in the Land of Ideas"
2009 (see www.land-of-ideas.org).

Recently, ESSL had gone operational with a completely revised ESWD software version. This renders display and quality-control of data on its multilingual public web portal www.essl.org/ESWD more convenient. Options for weather services to collaborate have been enhanced: this includes customised protected web interfaces for partner weather services and local ESWD installations in the weather service's intranet. Currently, four weather services are ESSL partners: AEMet, DWD, NIMH, ZAMG.

► Earth Observation Handbook
The Handbook has just been
released and is available online at
www.eohandbook.com. It explains the vital role played by Earth
observation satellites in providing
the information needed by governments and policymakers. Prepared
under the auspices of ESA on
behalf of the Committee on Earth
Observation Satellites (CEOS), the
Handbook provides an overview
of existing Earth Observation (EO)
missions, their instruments and the
plans for upcoming missions.

► Forum on disaster reduction Around 170 experts from Germany, Austria and Switzerland discussed the challenges for disaster reduction in the 21st century during the 9th DKKV-Forum on 20 and 21 November 2008 in Offenbach. For the first time, the German Weather Service DWD hosted this forum of the German Committee for Disaster Reduction DKKV - the national platform in Germany within the International Strategy for Disaster Reduction (ISDR). The forum discussed strategies for adaptation to climate change focussing on urban and regional planning, improvement of natural hazard forecast and warning systems, vital infrastructure and the energy sector, and contingency management.

▶ Earth Explorer

ESA has been working on candidates for the fourth Core Mission of Earth Explorer which is planned to be launched in the first half of the next decade. The six mission concepts being evaluated are:

- SCOPE: Observes atmospheric carbon dioxide.
- BIOMASS: Observes global forest biomass.
- COREH20: Observes snow and ice.
- FLEX: Observes photosynthesis.
- **PREMIER**: Observes atmospheric composition.
- TRAQ: Observes tropospheric composition.

The third Core Mission, Earth Clouds Aerosols and Radiation Explorer (EarthCARE), was selected in 2004 and will be launched in 2012. For more information see www.esa.int/esaLP/LPearthexp.html.

► EUMETSAT Web Portal

EUMETSAT has launched a new web portal, providing a central point for online access to all EUMET-SAT weather and climate data and dissemination services. Using state-of-the-art portal technology and featuring interoperability and standard metadata, the application, known as the 'Product Navigator', went online on 18 November 2008. It can be found at: navigator.eumet-sat.int/discovery/Explore.do.

► GIS/OGC standards

Météo-France, the UK Met Office and ECMWF jointly organised a workshop on the use of GIS systems in meteorology. The workshop was held at ECMWF in November 2008. Its aim was to:

- Review the use of OGC standards in geo-sciences
- Promote collaboration between meteorological services in order to define a set of common standards to enhance interoperability.
 The outcome of the workshop is the establishment of a roadmap for further collaborations and the setting up of testbeds to guarantee interoperability of OGC compliant web services for meteorological data and visualisation.
