I would like to thank the awards committee of the European Meteorological Society (EMS)

for selecting me for one of their Young Scientist Travel Awards, which supported my

attendance at the 12th EMS Annual Meeting and 9th European Conference on Applied

Climatology (ECAC).

The conference was very well organised, with parallel talks, plenary sessions and poster
